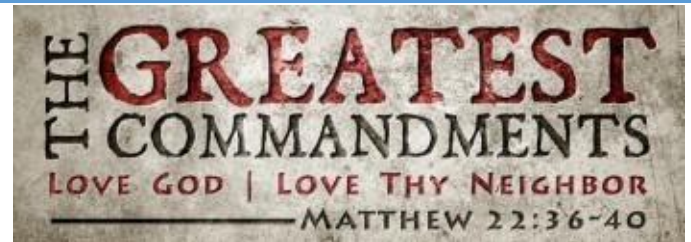

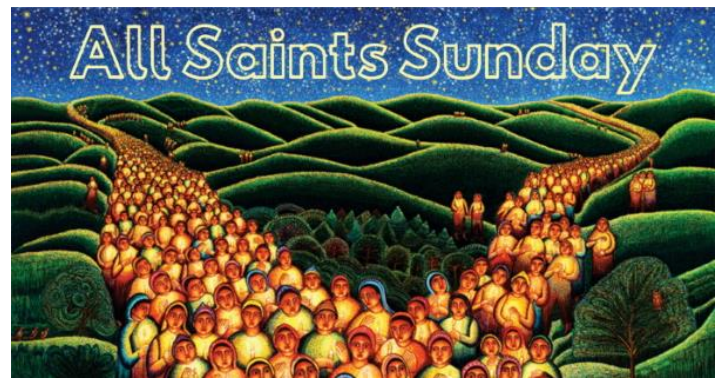

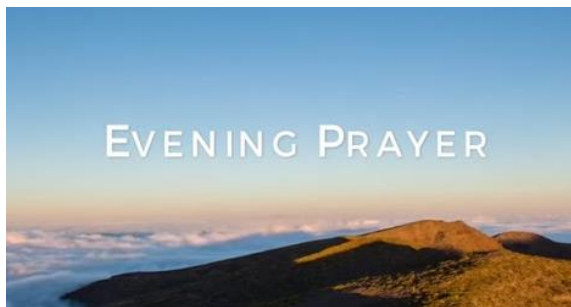

**ST. LUKE'S MOUNTAIN OF FOOD THANKSGIVING OFFERING**

Contrary to our previous articles, this year Atascadero Loaves and Fishes (now known as ALF Food Pantry) WILL take donations of actual food. They would prefer money, but they will also happily take food. We will be amassing non-perishable food, healthy food under the altar from **November 5 through 19**. Think canned veggies, boxes of non-sugar cereal, mac and cheese boxes, pound bags of rice, beans, and pasta, jars of peanut butter, or spaghetti sauce. There will also be a receptacle under the altar for your cash and checks made out to St. Luke's but designated for ALF. Food and money will be passed along to ALF after the 19<sup>th</sup> along with the proceeds of our summer Farmer's Market. As the nights grow colder and we hope for the beginning of the rain, please reflect with gratitude on the abundance of food, warmth and shelter each of us enjoys and consider what you can joyfully share with those who are in need. – Outreach Committee.



**SENIOR WARDEN TASK REALLOCATION UPDATE**

We are happy to report that many of the former tasks of the Senior Warden have been claimed by church members. We have a person dealing with the payroll. We have a person dealing with the scheduling of officiants for the Sunday morning services. We have a proofreader for the bulletin. We have people who will receive calls for Pastoral Care and will follow up with those who are ill and a person who will begin an adult study after the first of the year. We have people who will set agendas for Vestry and annual meetings and a person who will lead the Vestry meetings. The Clerk, the Jr. Warden, the Treasurer and Bookkeeper have all agreed to continue in their current positions. We are whittling down that formidable list of jobs.

Notice that most of the above mentioned tasks say “a person”. The bench is not very deep. We need everyone who is able to pitch in. If you have not yet decided what work you will do to support St. Luke's, you still have a chance to work with and support others in the above tasks or to take up one of the jobs not yet claimed. Notably we are still in need of a person to serve as the official signer for the Vestry on contracts for St. Luke's, or you could be a person who receives bills and writes purchase orders so the bookkeeper can write the checks, or you could receive and amass the articles for the newsletter and pass these along to Sylvia in a timely and coherent manner. You could be a person who is willing to attend the next Eucharistic Minister training so you can lead Morning Prayer. Please check over the list you received in church, or got in last week's newsletter and find a task that you can do with interest and joy and get in touch with me. We hope to have a plan in place by the next Vestry meeting, Nov. 12 so do it soon! Thank you. – Kathy Hansen.

VESTRY OF THE WHOLE CONGREGATION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS  
October 8, 2023

The Vestry of the Whole meeting opened with prayer, by Leann Brooks, at 10:03 am. Twelve people were present with four members attending on Zoom. The Minutes and the Agenda were approved, and the Vestry Covenant read.

Kathy Hansen gave an update on the Senior Warden job description. She asked that people look over the various categories and put their name next to the areas they could help with. A few of the key points of a lengthy discussion, follow: *Will there be a single point of contact for each committee?* We were cautioned that a central point of control, to make sure all is done on time, is needed. Others felt that we need to trust each other as we are all adults and are motivated to do it on our own.

*We were then asked how we are going to resolve the negativity issue with the Bishop. That needs to be done so the new Senior Warden is not burdened with it.* A motion was made to contact Canon Martha and ask for a communication workshop to work kindly and help with the transition of a Senior Warden in internal and external communication. The motion was seconded and passed, and three people were tasked to create that letter to Canon Martha.

The dedication of the Bob Cummings Fellowship Hall is scheduled for October 15, and Pastor Ellen Ayres will do the dedication. A potluck will follow.

Bids on the staircase have come in. The two trees near the staircase need to be removed. Work on pruning the oak tree cost \$1250, with an additional \$450 needed to treat the tree. A motion was made to allow the Junior Warden to use the money in the fund for the work on the trees. It passed.

Other business of the meeting: A new Coastal Copy lease was accepted; Pledge cards have been mailed, but few pledges have come in at this point. Speakers will be giving brief talks on stewardship, during the announcements on Sundays; The Bishop will only count pledge income when considering what kind of priest, we can afford.

One word description of the meeting, which ended at 11:12 am, was given by those in attendance. A few of those words listed: *informative, eye opening, productive, puzzling, anxiety-provoking, affirming.*

The meeting ended with a prayer, by Leann Brooks.

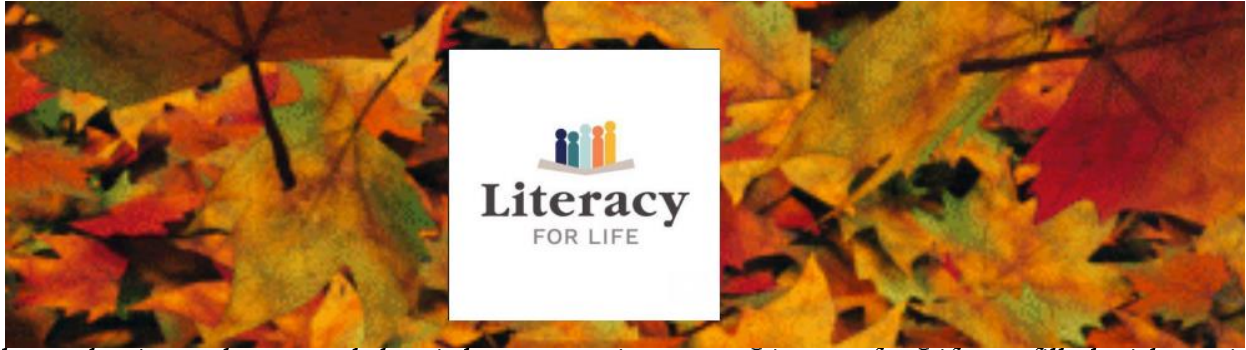


**Stewardship Ingathering November 19<sup>th</sup>**

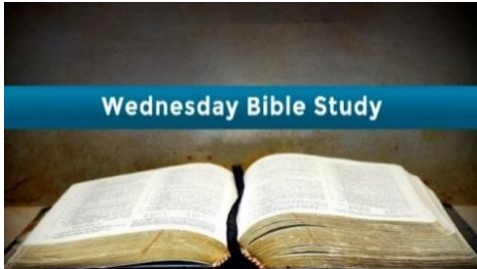
