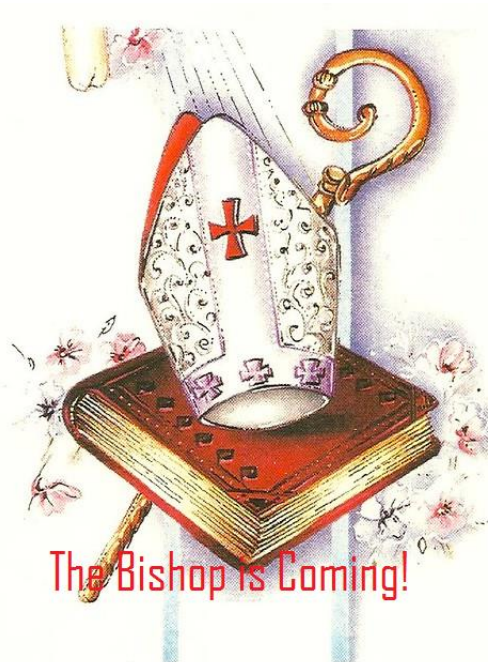

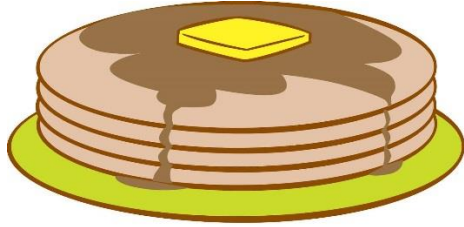

VESTRY OF THE WHOLE CONGREGATION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

January 14, 2024

St. Luke's was pleased to have Canon Martha Korienek with us, on January 14, 2024. After an uplifting, spiritual, Holy Eucharist, Canon Martha opened the Annual Meeting with prayer. The Agenda and the Minutes were adopted as well as A Special Rule of Order, which allowed the hybrid meeting with Zoom. Candidates for various leadership positions were elected: Junior Warden, Ann Holley, Treasurer, Leann Brooks; Vestry Clerk, Alice Baker-Taber. Delegates for 2024 are Marnie Burkett and Judy Lewis, and the alternate delegate is Alice Baker-Taber.

Mike Ferree graciously agreed to be the new Senior Warden for St. Luke's. An email to Bishop Lucinda, asking for her consent to allow Michael Ferree as Sr. Warden was sent, and she agreed.

A motion was made and passed to split the proceeds from fundraisers, 50/50 with one half being allocated for Outreach and one half being allocated for Capital Fund, Stair replacement.

A beautiful, hand-woven scarf and a uniquely designed trivet was given to Holly Cooper with thanks for her many years as St. Luke's Sr. Warden. The meeting then moved into a lively discussion with Canon Martha. She asked if there were any questions, and there were many!

A few points of discussion follow:

We need a Deacon and it's not fair that St. James has a priest and a Deacon, and we have neither. Response: St. Luke's doesn't need a Deacon as a Deacon's purpose is to go out into the world and St. Luke's already does a fine job of doing that.

We need a spiritual representative for such times when we need someone to talk to about our private innermost fears, or times in the hospital etc. Response: Some parishes will contract with a Supply Priest for those services, but they are paid for by the hour, as their time is invaluable.

When a "closed congregation" was brought up, Canon Martha gave us a description of the various sized churches and mentioned a book, *Eat This Bread*, that we might read. The church descriptions are: 30 members = a Family church (St. Luke's); 50-100 members = Pastoral (affiliation with Pastor); 100-300 members = Program (affiliation with groups); 300 plus members = Corporation.

Canon Martha told us she was sorry the search process is taking so long. Considering, St. Luke's is doing really well. She said she appreciated our patience and keeping our hopes and concerns known.

Canon Martha ended the meeting with a closing prayer at 11:13 am.



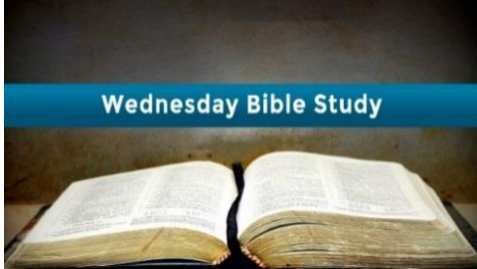

THE BIDDING BOOK & PRAYER REQUESTS



Over the past several years the parish prayer list has experienced an enormous growth. This warms the heart. The issue has become how to most effectively offer these prayers during our worship services over the course of a week. So effectively offer our intercessions and thanksgivings we will do the following;

During the Sunday services we will pray only for those who are listed in the bidding book (which you will find on the podium at the back of the church) and from the 'chat' on Zoom. During Evening Prayer on Tuesdays and Thursdays we will offer our prayers using the parish prayer list which is managed by the Daughters of the King. This prayer list is updated and refreshed on a regular basis.

We are grateful for the faithfulness of the community in praying for those in need.

We will review this practice of sharing our corporate prayer concerns on a regular basis.
