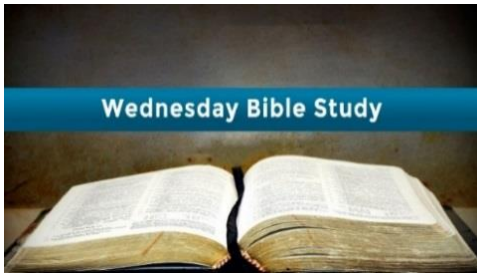
2ND SUNDAYS AT ST. LUKE'S

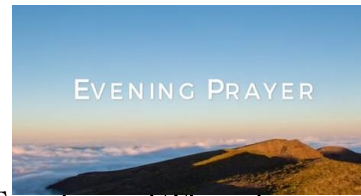
