

GET ON THE BUS BLESSINGS

get on the DUS

On Saturday, April 13, 2024 Mary Gruber and I received many blessings when we volunteered to be a part of the Get On the Bus ministry.

That day Get On The Bus helped transform the California Men's Colony prison visiting room into a fun, non-threatening family environment with child-centered activities. The children eat, play games, or participate in arts and crafts with their fathers. The visit provided a positive family interaction and allows children and parents the ability to touch, hug and reconnect after the long separation.

While the children and guardians were meeting with the father one of the Get on the Bus volunteers took pictures of the dad with their

children and caregivers. Once the pictures were finished, they were rushed to the Arise Central Coast church (the large Pentecostal church on the hill behind KSBY) in San Luis Obispo. While this was going on at the prison many volunteers were at the church setting up a room set aside for crafts and face painting, a room and an area with sofas for quiet reflection, the youth room was cleared for games and an area for indoor soccer (it rained all that day), ping pong and other games, the kitchen with an open window was turned into an ice cream serving area and bag meals were constructed for the trip home. When the photos were brought to the church many volunteers put together gift envelopes with the picture of them with their dad in a frame, cards with envelopes, stamps and pens. Then these giftwrapped envelopes are put on the tables awaiting the arrival of the children from the prison. When the children arrive on the buses or van, they are escorted in to the greeting area where they find their envelopes and the place they will sit. This is a heartfelt time for the children and their families as they get to see the pictures of their dad that commemorates their time with their dad. Then there is a free time for the children to have ice cream, drinks, arts, crafts, face painting, play games or enjoy a quiet time with their caregiver at the table or on the quiet areas. About 4 PM the children get a back pack, teddy bear and a sack meal to get on the bus for their long trip home. This is a long day for the caregivers and children. They came from as far away as north of Sacramento and San Diego.

What is Get On The Bus? A ministry that unites children with their fathers or mothers in prison. Get On The Bus was founded in 1999 by Sister Suzanne Jabro. This dynamic program gathers children and their caregivers or guardians from all across California and makes it possible for them to visit their fathers in prison.

Here are some ways you can help: Please donate to help these children to come see their incarcerated parent and/or volunteer to set up the event after they see their loved one at California Men's Colony. Mary and I are blessed to have participated in this ministry. If you have any questions about our wonderful day, please talk with me or Mary.

EFM FOR 2024-2025





About our Speaker:


