Moving Forward in our Search for a New Priest

In addition to the possibility of "yoking" St. Luke's with St. Benedict's in Los Osos, we have been approached by clergy who would be interested in a half-time position, providing we were to offer a parsonage (or housing) valued at the equivalency of quarter (1/4) time cash stipend of the priest's full time salary.

To do this would involve moving the office to the Sunday School room in the Undercroft, and re-converting the cottage into a habitable dwelling. The work would include adding a shower/tub enclosure to the bathroom in the space currently occupied by the built-in bookcase in the counter's room, adding a hot water heater, modifying the existing kitchen by adding a standard kitchen sink, refrigerator and stove.

The current status of the plumbing and electrical lines is unknown and would have to be professionally evaluated, plans drawn, permits pulled, contractors hired, time and materials calculated, and the reconversion completed. We would also need to upgrade the heater, add window coverings, and stabilize the back stairs. A rough estimate of the shortest time table to

complete the re-conversion is one year, if we were to start immediately.

Whether the interested clergy would be in a position to wait that long is questionable. However, once made habitable, the housing would be an asset in terms of its rental value. The downside is that if the half-time inquirer had moved on, we would still be in the position of looking for another priest, and we would be another year out in our search, although we would have a parsonage.

I have discussed this, and other concerns with Bishop Lucinda who has agreed that she would like to discuss, generally, the future of St. Luke's with the Vestry of the Whole Church in person on Monday, May 8th, from 6:00 – 7:30 PM. VESTRY OF THE WHOLE CONGREGATION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS March 12, 2023

Leann Brooks began the Vestry of the Whole meeting with a prayer at 10:06 am. The Minutes were then accepted, the Agenda adopted and the Vestry Covenant affirmed.

Moving on to the **Treasurer's Report**, Leann Brooks stated that financially, St. Luke's is in a healthy position. She explained the Bergen unrestricted fund is not limited to using only the gain, stated the Net Income is \$1500 under budget year to date, and the utilities are above budget \$448.84/\$320.00. The Financial Report was accepted.

The Senior Warden Report was given by Holly Cooper where she stressed that the deadline for St. Luke's weekly publications is every Tuesday, at 4:30 pm. She went on to say that there has been no response from Canon Martha regarding St. Luke's search for a new priest. Canon Martha, Holly, and leadership at St. Benedicts will meet to discuss the possibilities of "yoking" the two churches, which is not the same as merging. In the meantime, Pastor Karen will be the supply priest on the first Sunday of each month; Reverend Richard will supply in May and June on the third Sunday of the month. Kathryn Showers graciously offered to host Rev. Richard and his wife for the next 2 months when he supplies.

The Junior Warden's Report was next on the agenda, with Ann Holley reporting. Kristen Bethel, from the Insurance Company, has issued a new facility use form and Ann listed the organizations currently using St. Luke's for their meetings. Wilshire Community Services is interested in using St. Luke's office, on the third Tuesday of each month, to meet with Hospice Volunteers. The vestry agreed to allow Ann and Wilshire discuss the details. Regarding the back stairs, a contract has been signed with the architect!

Mary Gruber reported that a free, Outreach Agape BBQ is being considered for the homeless and the neighborhood, at St. Luke's, on Sunday, May 21. Potluck items and people to barbecue the hamburgers and hot dogs will be needed. Any leftover food will be distributed to the homeless.

A meeting evaluation was taken, and people were very enthusiastic. Comments ranged from "great", "informative", "we like the circle configuration", and "the best meeting in a long time"! Everyone is invited and encouraged to attend the next Vestry of the Whole meeting. Submitted by Leann Brooks

Beloved Family in Christ, Warm greetings from the Board of SLO Canterbury, an Episcopal Campus Ministry.

I wonder if you'd take a moment to recall the early years of your adult life. Where were you living? Were you working? Were you a student? Who else was there as you began to



develop your own mind? Did you have someone to talk to and help you through hard questions? What spiritual grief, healing, and growth happened during that time?

Roughly 33,000 college students live in our region, studying at Cal Poly and Cuesta College. Conservative Christian groups dominate the campus ministry scene. While full of high-production activities and well-meaning leaders, in practice, fitting into these groups more often than not requires conformity to traditional roles, behaviors, and hierarchies.

Coming out of COVID-era restrictions, SLO Canterbury sought to reimagine our way of ministry. Help came in June 2022 as a two-year Diocesan Community Trailblazer grant. That grant brought The Rev. Jen Crompton to us as a half-time Campus Chaplain.

In their work, we see a campus ministry of belonging and radical hospitality, where students may grow into their authentic selves, with all the intersectional identities that may entail. We observe a ministry model like that of Jesus, walking alongside others on the road to Emmaus, and seeking out and building relationships with those excluded from the dominant group, in the hope that Jesus is made known to those with whom we connect. We believe that 33,000 college students are worthy of our commitment to ensure that this inclusive campus ministry endures beyond our Community Trailblazer grant. Our students are worthy of a long-term, full-time Chaplain.

The Board has set a goal of increasing our annual budget from \$43,000 to \$200,000 annually to provide salary, benefits, and housing for a full-time Chaplain, and cover program expenses. We seek individual donations, Parish and Diocesan contributions, grants, and in-kind gifts (apartment? ADU? house?). We are grateful to have already been awarded \$25,000 in grants from the Diocese and the Episcopal Church Office of Young Adult Campus Ministries.


COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT CONTINUES



St. Luke's will continue to report their community engagement to Bishop Lucinda as part of St. Luke's Annual Community (ACE) Program. The

ACE program captures the number of times members engaged with or were involved or were involved in contact (i.e. pastoral care or prayer requests) with other members or friends of the congregation or provided service to individuals or other organizations like feeding folks at ECHO, helping set up an apartment for Transitional Food & Shelter, or tutored someone in reading. In the last half of 2022, St. Lukeans reported 6,055 contacts with members and friends of the congregation and 4,200 contacts with the larger community outside St. Luke's. Keep up the good work.
