To our knowledge, there has been no formal inquiry to the diocese. The Vestry of the Whole tabled a discussion of the possibility of converting the cottage to a residence until its next meeting.

VESTRY OF THE WHOLE CONGREGATION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS  
June 11, 2023

The Agenda and the Minutes were adopted, the Jr. and Sr. Warden reports were accepted, and the Vestry norms were reviewed.

Financial reports given by Leann: Pledged income is below budget YTD. Close but still under budget. Expenses are pretty much on target YTD. MSP Marnie/ Sam (1 abstention) To accept the Treasurer's report with thanks.

Sr. Warden's Report: The line-up of future clergy will be: Rev. Karen Siegfriedt for the first Sundays indefinitely. Rev. Ellen Ayres on the third Sundays through the end of the year, except in September. The 2nd, 4th and 5th Sundays will be Morning Prayer. Deacon Jim will preach occasionally although, the Bishop has redistributed Deacon's duties so that Jim will be  $\frac{3}{4}$  time at St. James and  $\frac{1}{4}$  time at St. Luke's. As the Deacon can only preach once per month, and must sometimes preach at St. James, this will mean that he will be preaching less at St. Luke's.

There is no new news on the priest search. There has only been one passing inquiry by someone who was interested in being paid  $\frac{1}{4}$  and living in a parsonage but there was no formal application from this person. There was some discussion of the idea of renovating the Cottage and Ann said there is too much going on right now to be able to explore this at this time.

Possibly when the stairway is done and the undercroft repairs are finished we can consider pros and cons, cost, etc. (Later in the meeting Sam asked why we are not looking into this more actively as at the very least the cottage could be used as rental income. There is disagreement on whether it would interfere with our non-profit status to rent out the cottage if we did not have a priest interested in using it. This discussion was tabled to next month.)

Holly reminded us that we need to get many responsible people in the congregation Live Scanned to comply with California laws. This involves applying for an ORI number in order to be able to receive the results of fingerprinting. Holly said she needs help getting this started.

Jr. Warden's Report: Ann reported that the plans are completed for the staircase. There has been no bill for the cost of the design as of yet. The Vestry will need to vote on accepting the plan and then we can get bids for the actual building of the stairs. It may be necessary to vote for extra funds to pay for things. The insurance company has agreed upon an amount they will pay for Undercroft repairs. The asbestos removal is complete (not including the kitchen and Sunday School Room). The air in the undercroft will be tested on Monday. When it is safe, the next phase will be the dry walling.

Kathryn and Holly volunteered to do the inventory of the contents of the Vestry and the Sacristy. Betsy and Ann have completed all the other inventories needed by the insurance company.

MSP Joe/Sam- A motion was made by Kathryn to extend the Vestry of the Whole model for one year. Holly pointed out that if we want to permanently change to this model, we will need to change the corporation by-laws and this will involve consulting with the chancellor's office. For now, we are simply extending it for another year. Holly will consult with the Bishop and Chancellor's offices.

Zoom Discussion: A motion was made, seconded, and passed to allow, subject to technical availability, people attending on Zoom to vote on any issue that comes up, provided that they have identified themselves prior to the beginning of the meeting.

Vestry Covenant: A motion was made, seconded, and passed to adopt the Vestry Covenant as shown on the June 11 agenda with the following changes: on the 9th line "Do not interrupt or speak over someone else". On line 10 "Refrain from side conversations during the Vestry meeting" There was quite a lot of discussion of not having parking lot discussions with the group deciding that this issue is covered in several other lines of the covenant, especially "Support Vestry decisions."

Trunk Rummage Sale – Jeannie presented a plan to have a rummage sale on July 1 which would be structured like a swap meet with each person selling their rummage out of their own space and turning all funds back to the church. Each person would be responsible for bringing, selling, keeping track of money, and removing unsold items by Saturday afternoon. MSP Leann/Ann to allow Jeannie to hold this sale. The meeting closed with prayer.

- Former All-American swimmer so if you love to swim, I can take you to the pool!

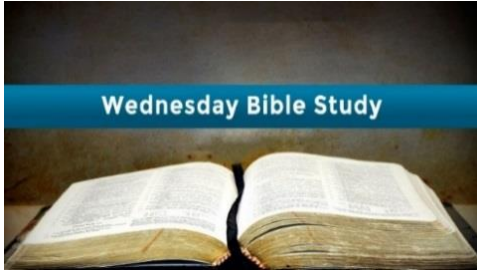
